THE YOUNG LIVES STUDY CONTEXT INSTRUMENT (PILOT VERSION – VIETNAM)

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Community definition: Administrative areas will normally be used as a starting point (operational definition, referred to in this survey as "Localities"). Commune is the lowest administrative unit in Vietnam. The term "locality," therefore, refers to the whole commune. In Vietnam, children in the sample in each commune come from not one, but several, villages. There is some flexibility in how the relevant community space will be defined for each of the modules. For instance, the relevant community space for the sections included in the Child-Specific Module is one that encompasses the relevant provider —as much as the user— of the specific service investigated in each section (Education, Health, etc).

Selection of informants: Each section has a protocol to be followed to identify one or several informants, as appropriate.
