**FIELDWORKER:** Using 8 cups labelled with each of the 8 categories of activities, explain the respondent what each activity means (remember that items about work (Q.5) and school (Q.6) include travelling times. Now give the respondant 24 pebbles and explain that these represent 24 hours of a **typical day** (from Monday to Friday, excluding holidays, festivals, etc.). Ask the respondant to distribute the 24 pebbles according to the time spent in each task, starting with sleeping time and then with the activities on which the child spends most of his time. Make sure all 24 pebbles are allotted. Now ask the respondent to confirm if they represent his typical day and allow him/her to reallocate the pebbles if needed.
